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Introduction

Based on the Saudi Food and Drug Authority's system issued under the esteemed Cabinet Resolution No. (31) dated 24/1/1428H, ratified by Royal Decree No. (M/6) dated 25/1/1428H, the authorization for clearing imported food, pharmaceutical products, medical devices, pesticides, and everything related to the Authority's scope of work, after conducting the necessary inspections and analyses, falls within the executive tasks assigned to the Authority.

This guide has been prepared to assist individuals involved in the food sector in understanding the requirements and conditions for food clearance, as well as the procedures followed, in order to facilitate and expedite the completion of their transactions. It aims to prevent rejection, delays, or losses that may arise from a lack of knowledge of these

Scope

All food imported for commercial, non-commercial, industrial, and consumption purposes.

Objective

To clarify the conditions and requirements for food clearance through customs ports.



Definitions:

The Authority:

The Saudi Food and Drug Authority.

Food:

Anything intended for human consumption as food or drink, whether fresh, processed, semi-processed, or raw. It also includes milk and any substance used in the manufacturing, preparation, or processing of food.

Clearance:

The decision issued regarding approval or denial of imported shipments through customs ports.

Health Certificate:

A document (paper or electronic) issued by the competent authority in the country of origin or export country, indicating the safety and suitability of the exported food according to the requirements of relevant technical regulations. It may include the registration number of the food establishment or alternative equivalent measures that are approved.

Halal Slaughter Certificate:

A certificate accompanying shipments of meat, poultry, and their products, containing information such as the slaughter date, expiry, etc.

Halal Certificate:

A document certifying that a product, service, or systems comply with halal requirements in Islamic law, including certificates for halal slaughter, halal-certified establishments, farms, slaughterhouses, and facilities, as well as certificates for primary product ingredients, additives, and components that include meat derivatives, rennet, gelatine, animal fats, oils, and their derivatives or any product that requires a halal certificate according to technical regulations.



Technical Regulation:

A mandatory document that describes the characteristics of food or its production and manufacturing methods, including the regulations governing it. It also includes terms, symbols, packaging, or labelling of the product or its production method.

Certificate of Conformity:

Third-party certification for products, operations, systems, or individuals.

Port of Entry:

The location where the shipment arrives and is cleared for entry into the Kingdom.

Proficiency Test (PT):

A proficiency test based on inter-comparison used to assess the performance of participants (which may include laboratories for inspection and calibration, inspection authorities, or individuals) in specific tests or measurements, and to monitor their ongoing performance.



Mandatory General Requirements for Food Clearance:

Before importing food, the importer must ensure that:

- The imported food complies with the approved technical regulations and the circulars published on the Authority's website.
- The importer has registered their establishment on "Ghad" platform with the Saudi Food and Drug Authority (SFDA).
- The importer has registered the food items and products they wish to import on "Ghad" platform.
- Clearance requests are submitted via the Authority's electronic systems.
- Clearance requests are submitted through the "Fasah" trade platform.
- A licensed warehouse is available in accordance with the Authority's requirements. (Exemptions apply for local factories importing raw materials that are used in manufacturing their products, as well as importers whose total number of shipments per calendar year does not exceed 5 shipments, with a combined weight not exceeding 2,000 kg).

General Notes:

- 1. Compliance with the conditions for clearing organic food products is required. (here)
- 2. Adherence to the list of food establishments exporting to the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia. (here)
- 3. Compliance with circulars issued by the authority and published on the website.
- 4. Adherence to the general guidelines for the transportation of food to the Kingdom. (here)
- 5. A copy of the Halal Certificate: For food products that require a Halal certificate according to the conditions and requirements, in addition to products that carry the label or logo of "Halal" issued by Halal centres designated by the Saudi Halal Center.
- 6. A copy of the Halal slaughter certificate for meat, poultry, and raw gelatine intended for food, issued by recognized Halal centres accredited by the Saudi Halal Center. (here)
- 7. A copy of the Phytosanitary Certificate for grains/agricultural crops/fresh vegetables and fruits.
- 8. A certificate must be provided to prove the authenticity of any logo placed on food product labels as per the Saudi Gulf Technical Regulation No. SFDA FD. GSO 9 " Labelling of Pre-packaged Food Stuffs ", Section 3.4. When using any specific Halal logo, quality mark, or organic product... etc., proof of the authenticity of such claims must be provided.



- 9. According to the Food Law and its Executive Regulation issued by the Board of Directors of the Saudi Food and Drug Authority under Resolution No. (03-16-1439) dated 9/4/1439H, and based on what is stated in Article 27, "The authority has the right to withdraw food samples free of charge to verify their compliance with the provisions of this law and its regulations, and analyse them if necessary in its laboratories or in laboratories registered with it", and Article 43 "The authority may consult with any other government entity or the private sector to carry out any task assigned to it under this law and its regulations." To verify that food meets the authority's requirements, samples may be withdrawn from the imported shipment and sent to the laboratories designated by the authority for analysis to ensure compliance with the authority's conditions. The importer is responsible for the cost of analysis and sample testing.
- 10. Compliance with Circular No. 41072 dated 21/05/1440H regarding the regulations and conditions to be followed when importing meat, poultry, fish, shellfish, and aquatic life.
- 11. Compliance with Circular No. 41072 dated 21/05/1440H regarding the regulations and conditions to be followed when importing meat, poultry, fish, shellfish, and aquatic life.
- 12. Importers must retain the original clearance documents for five years from the clearance date. The authority has the right to request additional documents for clearance if necessary.
- 13. The importer must pay the costs for sample analysis and testing to avoid delays or facing violations and fines.



Conditions for Clearing Non-Commercial Products:

First: Personal Use Products

- Ensure the shipment is not displayed in local markets and is used only for its intended purpose.
- The importer is fully responsible for the safety and security of the imported products.

Second: Imported Food Samples for Scientific Studies and Research (Not for Human Consumption)

- A letter must be submitted via the "Fasah" platform detailing the imported samples and their intended use, along with a commitment from the establishment/importer not to sell or display them in local markets.
- A copy of the research/study approval from the regulating authority must be provided.
- A commercial invoice and bill of lading must be submitted.
- In the case of research samples, proof must be attached showing the samples are for scientific research, provided by the institution to which the researcher belongs.

Third: Display and Marketing Samples Not for Sale

- The labels of food products must include the phrase 'Free Sample'.
- A commitment must be submitted via the "Fasah" platform from the establishment/importer ensuring the samples are only for the intended purpose and will not be sold in local or international markets after the intended use is completed.
- Import of display and marketing samples from animal-origin products is only allowed from accredited establishments, and approval must be obtained from the authority by sending a request via email at CEC@SFDA.GOV.SA before importation.



Fourth: Requirements for Clearing Proficiency Test (PT) Samples and Standard Materials for Food Product Analysis

- A copy of the invoice from the manufacturer or packager indicating the quantities and the name of the proficiency test being sent.
- A copy of the letter from the requesting authority, detailing the request for the samples or standard materials to be cleared, or any document proving the same.
- A copy of the bill of lading.
- All of the above documents should be submitted via the "Fasah" platform (Tabadul) and referred to the authority to complete the clearance procedures.

Fifth: Imported Food Samples for Analysis in private laboratories within the Kingdom

- A letter from the requesting authority for analysis must be submitted via the "Fasah" platform (Tabadul) detailing the products to be cleared and the purpose of importation, along with the name of the laboratory.
- A copy of the invoice must be provided.
- Only the specified quantities for analysis are allowed to be imported.
- The laboratory must be accredited by the SFDA.
- A commitment from the accredited laboratory must be submitted on the "Fasah" platform (Tabadul) stating that the imported products will not be displayed, sold, or used in any way other than for analysis purposes. Additionally, any remaining samples must be destroyed after completing the required analyses.



Food Products for Manufacturing Purposes, Including Factories and Restaurants

These include food products not intended for direct display or sale to consumers but imported for the following purposes:

- Manufacturing in licensed food factories in the Kingdom.
- Restaurants, where the imported food product will not be served or consumed directly by the consumer and will undergo processing/preparation. (The exception applies only to products used within food preparation areas and does not include products displayed on the consumer's table, such as sauces and flavourings.)

Requirements:

- The materials used for manufacturing purposes must comply with the approved technical regulations.
- These products are exempt from clause 1.2.7 of the "SFDA.FD/GSO 9" Technical Regulation (Labelling of Pre-packaged Food Stuffs) which states: "The labels of food products and their accompanying information must be in Arabic, and if another language or languages are used alongside Arabic, all data in the other languages must match the Arabic version." An exception allows submission of a commitment via the Fasah platform that the label will be in English.

Mandatory Technical Regulations (Specifications Store):

<u>These regulations are updated regularly, and it is essential to review the updates before</u> importing food products.
